

RIPON COLLEGE CUDDESDON



Ripon College Cuddesdon, the Theological College, is in a small village near Wheatley. It was founded by Samuel Wilberforce in April 1853. The original buildings were designed by G. E. Street, the Diocesan architect and were first used as the Oxford Diocesan Seminary for the training of graduates from Oxford and Cambridge.

It became known as Cuddesdon College when it was first opened in April 1854, and over a century later, after enlargement, the college was joined together with Ripon Hall, changing its name to Ripon College Cuddesdon.

The new Bishop Edward King Chapel was built, and together with Harriet Monsell House Education Centre was opened in 2013. Many awards, both national and international have been bestowed on the Chapel, whose architect was Niall McLaughlin. Harriet Monsell House has included an enclosure for a community of five Anglican sisters who moved from Begbroke Priory, and work alongside staff and students, supporting prayer and spirituality.
